



Aboriginal Perspectives

Don't forget that Oak Hammock Marsh Interpretive Centre also offers programs year-round that emphasize various Aboriginal perspectives. The programs are 1 hour and cost \$2 per student, unless otherwise noted*.

Nature's Traditions (Gr. 1 - Gr. 6)

Discover how the cycling seasons shape the activities of people and are at the root of many traditions. Includes seasonal game, craft or activity.

Animal Teachers (Gr. 1 - Gr. 6)

Through crafts, stories, and games, discover how animals can be great teachers! Students will learn the importance of bison, turtle and other animals to Aboriginal cultures.

Aboriginal Games (Gr. 2 & up)

From tidluktoq to hoop and pole, games were and still are a fun way to learn important skills and lessons

Snowshoe Walkabout (Gr. 2 & up)

Unforgettable adventure awaits your group as you explore the marsh in winter.

Plants and People (Gr. 3 & up)

Discover some of the fascinating uses of marsh and prairie plants and their special significance to Aboriginal People.

Bannock Bake (Gr. 3 & up)

The history of Bannock is as varied and interesting as the cultures that make up Canada. Learn all about bannock as you make and cook your own over an open fire.

Snapshot of Aboriginal Cultures (Gr. 4 & up)

An introduction to Manitoba's Aboriginal groups, cultures and history with interactive games and activities.

Life of the Tipi (Gr. 3 & up)

Gathered under our large tipi (weather permitting), students will learn about the historical and contemporary uses of the tipi. They will then discover its physical and structural properties as they work together to set up a smaller tipi frame.

*Program is 1.5 hours and cost is \$3/student.

Voyageur Canoe (Gr. 5 & up)

Explore the marsh the way Aboriginal People have for hundreds of years in our large, voyageur-style canoes.

*Cost is \$4/student.

The Centre is located 20 min. north of Winnipeg and is open year-round.
