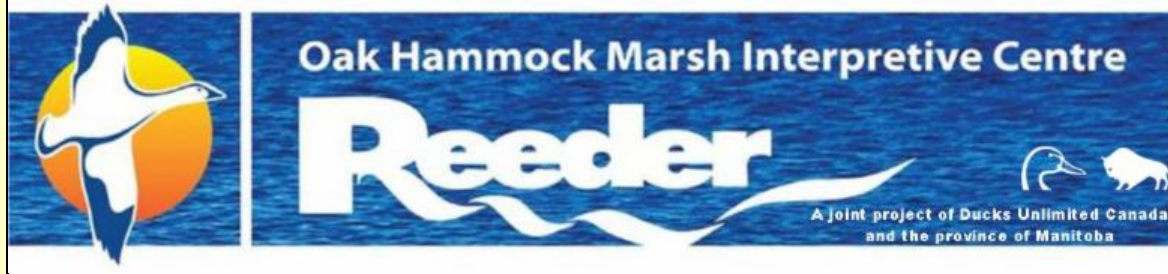

Take part in the **Snowflake Raffle** to win some great prizes and participate in fun games and other entertainment.

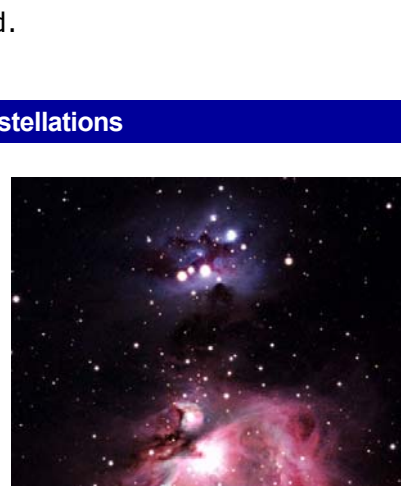
The Candy Cane Tea is available for \$12 per person.

Get to know Orion and other famous winter constellations as we prepare for the winter solstice, the best stargazing time of the year!



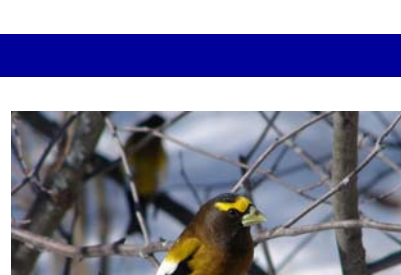

Come help us count our winter residents, while exploring the marsh and surrounding area during **Oak Hammock Marsh's Annual Christmas Bird Count**.

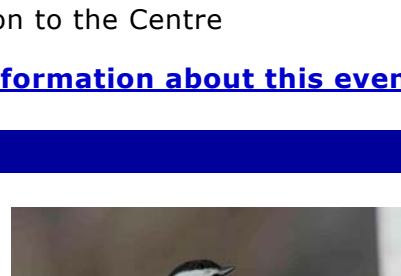

Who are they? What will they eat?

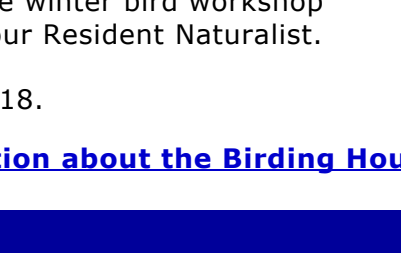
Find out the answers at the winter bird workshop hosted by **Paula Grief**, our Resident Naturalist.

December 29, 30 and January 2

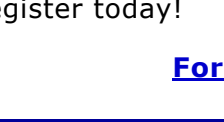
Enjoy winter by joining us for a frosty good time at winter camp!

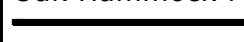
