

Decoy Carving Competition

May 3 & 4

The **Oak Hammock Marsh Carving Guild** will be hosting its Eleventh Annual Decoy Competition.

This event will take place at the **Oak Hammock Marsh Interpretive Centre** and will be open to True Hunting, Traditional Style and Contemporary Style Waterfowl Decoys, Rest of the Marsh and Stylized Representation of the Marsh Decoys.



This competition will feature five purchase awards:

1. The Oak Hammock Marsh Interpretive Centre will again be offering a purchase award for a Puddle Duck Decoy.
2. Oak Hammock Carving Guild Purchase Award sponsored by Richard Whitton.
3. The Rod Fowler Memorial Purchase Award sponsored by Russ Muth.

5. "Shadow" Purchase Award sponsored by John and Konrad Frye.

The **Oak Hammock Marsh Carving Guild Competition and Show** will also feature a 50/50 sale table where the carvers set the price for their carving and if sold 50% of sale price goes to the carver 50% to **Oak Hammock Marsh Interpretive Centre**.

May 10

International Migratory Bird Day is a special day dedicated to the celebration of migratory birds and to conservation awareness across the continent. It is celebrated annually on the second Saturday of May in the United States and Canada.

Warblers are one of the most diverse members of the passeriformes family (perching birds). They share some common characteristics, such as being fairly small, vocal, and insectivores. They tend to be more easily heard than seen and identification can be difficult and may be made on the basis of song alone.

Biodiversity Weekend

May 17 to 19

Wetlands, such as **Oak Hammock Marsh**, are among the most productive and ecologically diverse ecosystems on the planet. As an example, a staggering 300 species of birds have been recorded at the marsh. This represents close to 50% of all the birds found in Canada!



Wetlands are also home to many species of mammals, fish, reptiles and amphibians. During breeding season, visitors to **Oak Hammock Marsh** can listen to the croaking of seven of the twelve species of frogs and toads found in Manitoba!

Visitors will have the opportunity to discover and learn about the many different bird, fish, mammal, reptile, amphibian and invertebrate species that call **Oak Hammock Marsh** home. Several presentations will be offered throughout the day as well as some hands-on surveys.

This event is a great way to get acquainted and appreciate the amazing diversity of wildlife that surrounds us.
