

December 19 - 7:45 a.m.

The **116th Annual Christmas Bird Count** season is rapidly approaching. This event takes place all over North America and more than 50,000 observers participate each year. You could be one of them!



This huge conservation effort monitors the status and distribution of bird populations across the continent and contributes to a clearer picture of how the bird populations have changed over time.
