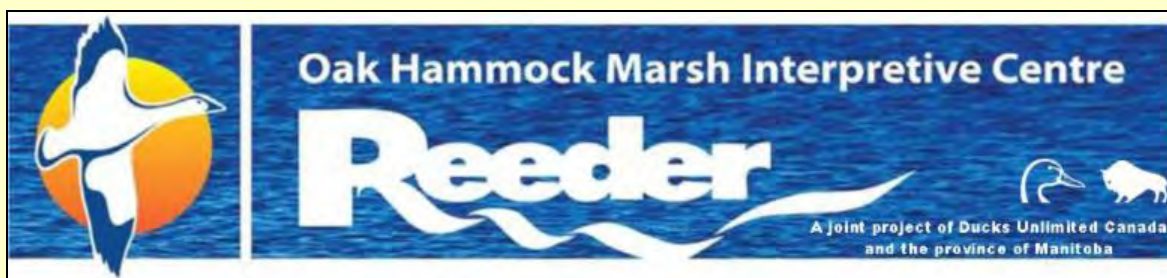

The first half of this event takes place in the comfort of our 120-seat theatre and is followed by an observation session from the rooftop if we have a clear sky.



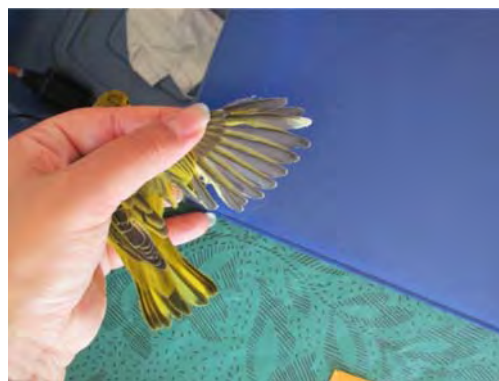

**Snowshoe Workshop**

January 28 - 1 p.m.

It is believed that snowshoes were likely invented 6000 to 8000 years ago by mimicking some wildlife adaptations. Many animals, such as the snowshoe hare, jackrabbit, and lynx have oversized feet enabling them to move quickly through deep snow.



Snowshoes were essential for fur traders, trappers and anyone whose life or living depended on the ability to get around in areas of deep and frequent snowfall.

Join us and learn about the different styles of snowshoes and their history. A snowshoe walk in the marsh and hot chocolate will follow.
