

Join us as she guides you through the avian world of this tropical island.


Workshop fee is **\$6 plus admission**. Pre-registration required.

Try your hand at **Snow Sculpting**. Bring your own tools and imagination. Some tools will be available to borrow (12 to 3:30 p.m.).


Join an interpreter on a snowshoe walk and look for clues of wildlife activity. Jackrabbits, coyotes and winter birds are still present and active in the marsh.
