

## Oak Hammock Marsh Wildlife Management

**Area** is one of North America's birding hotspots and a great destination for people of all ages.

This 36 km<sup>2</sup> Wildlife Management Area features a restored prairie marsh, aspen-oak bluff, waterfowl lure crops, artesian springs, some of Manitoba's last remaining patches of tall-grass prairie and 30 kilometres of trails for you to explore. It is home to 300 species of birds.

The award-winning Oak Hammock Marsh Interpretive Centre is located on the edge of the marsh. Open year-round, the Interpretive Centre visitors for programs like canoe excursions, snowshoe walks, critter dipping, and marsh walks.

Seasonal status and abundance codes:

Sp – March to May      Su – June to August  
F – Sept. to Nov.      W – Dec. to Feb.

**A** — Abundant: Seen on all visits to the preferred habitat, often in large numbers.

**C** — Common: Seen on most visits to the preferred habitat, numbers may vary.

**U** — Uncommon: Present every year in the preferred habitat in low numbers.

**R** — Rare: Present every year in very low numbers.

**O** — Occasional: Present less than once a year.

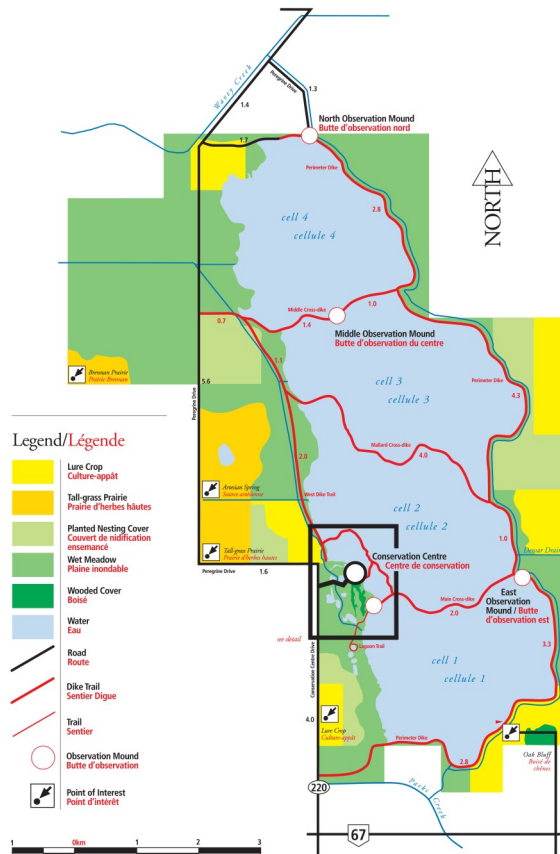
**Accidental:** May stray into the area, but not an expected occurrence.

**Extirpated:** No longer occurs at Oak Hammock Marsh but may be found elsewhere.

**Hypothetical:** Has been seen in the area, but lacks suitable documentation.

\*\* species suspected of having bred in the area

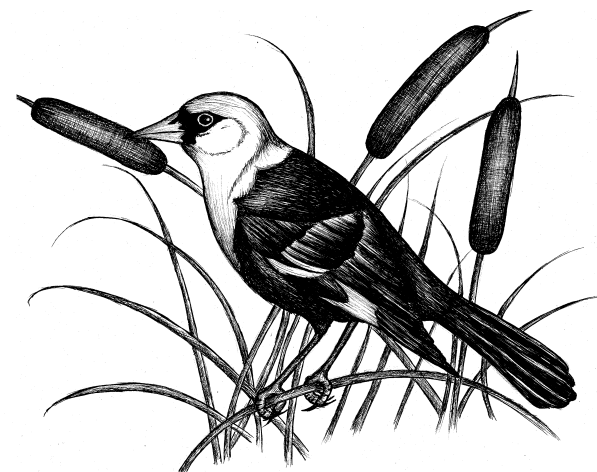
